<i>Nematoceras orbiculata</i> *	= <i>Corybas orbiculatus</i> aff.	August – October Short horns, hood edges rolled with pointed beak

<i>Pterostylis sp</i> *		Dec. Northern end of swamp	
<i>Singularibas oblongus</i>	= <i>Corybas oblongus</i>	Oct-Dec Spider orchid	
<i>Spiranthes novae zelandiae</i>	= <i>Spiranthes sinensis</i>	Jan. Pink flowers, locally rare	
<i>Thelymitra carnea</i>		Sep – Nov. 4 or 5 pink flowers Rare.	
<i>Thelymitra cyanea</i>		Nov – Mar Blue with dark blue stripes	
<i>Thelymitra formosa</i>		Dec. 12 – 18 blue or mauve flowers	

<i>Thelymitra hatchii</i>		Nov – Jan 6 lilac purple flowers PAGE 5
<i>Thelymitra ixiooides</i> *		Oct – Dec. Pale blue, dark spots and mauve hood
<i>Thelymitra longifolia</i>		Nov – Jan up to 20 white flowers (most common)
<i>Thelymitra nervosa</i>		Oct – Jan deep mauve 6 flowers
<i>Thelymitra pauciflora</i>		Nov – Jan Reddish purple, no spots or stripes more than 10 flowers
<i>Thelymitra pulchella</i> *		(1) Nov – Jan blue with dark blue stripes (2) Nov – Jan Rare white flowers with blue stripes
<i>Thelymitra venosa</i> *		Dec – Feb blue with dark blue stripes
<i>Winika cunninghamii</i>	= <i>Dendrobium cunninghamii</i>	Dec – Jan bamboo orchid epiphytic
